

Unit Awards Scheme have been learning about recycling in our Life Skills sessions. We started by looking at our own school to see what we recycle and what we don't. The school is driven by students and we have many alternative methods of recycling.

The students carried out a survey and discovered that 8 classrooms/areas did not recycle bottles, paper and card and within the school we do very little for compost recycling.

Resulting from this survey Unit Awards out of their budget have been out to Homebase in Bury St Edmunds and bought more recycling bins which we have since installed.

Now, in school we have recycling bins in all classrooms, a glass recycling bin in the staffroom, and vegetable peelings and food bins for compost in the staffroom, dining room and kitchen.

Please could all medical appointments/absences be reported before 9.00 am to the School Office. Please contact the school each day your child is absent; contact by email is fine.



Medical Reminders

If you child requires any medication, please ensure that this is handed into the office or Mrs Beadman. Medication will need to be in its original packet along with the relevant paperwork. The item must be clearly labelled with the students name and the instructions of administration.
