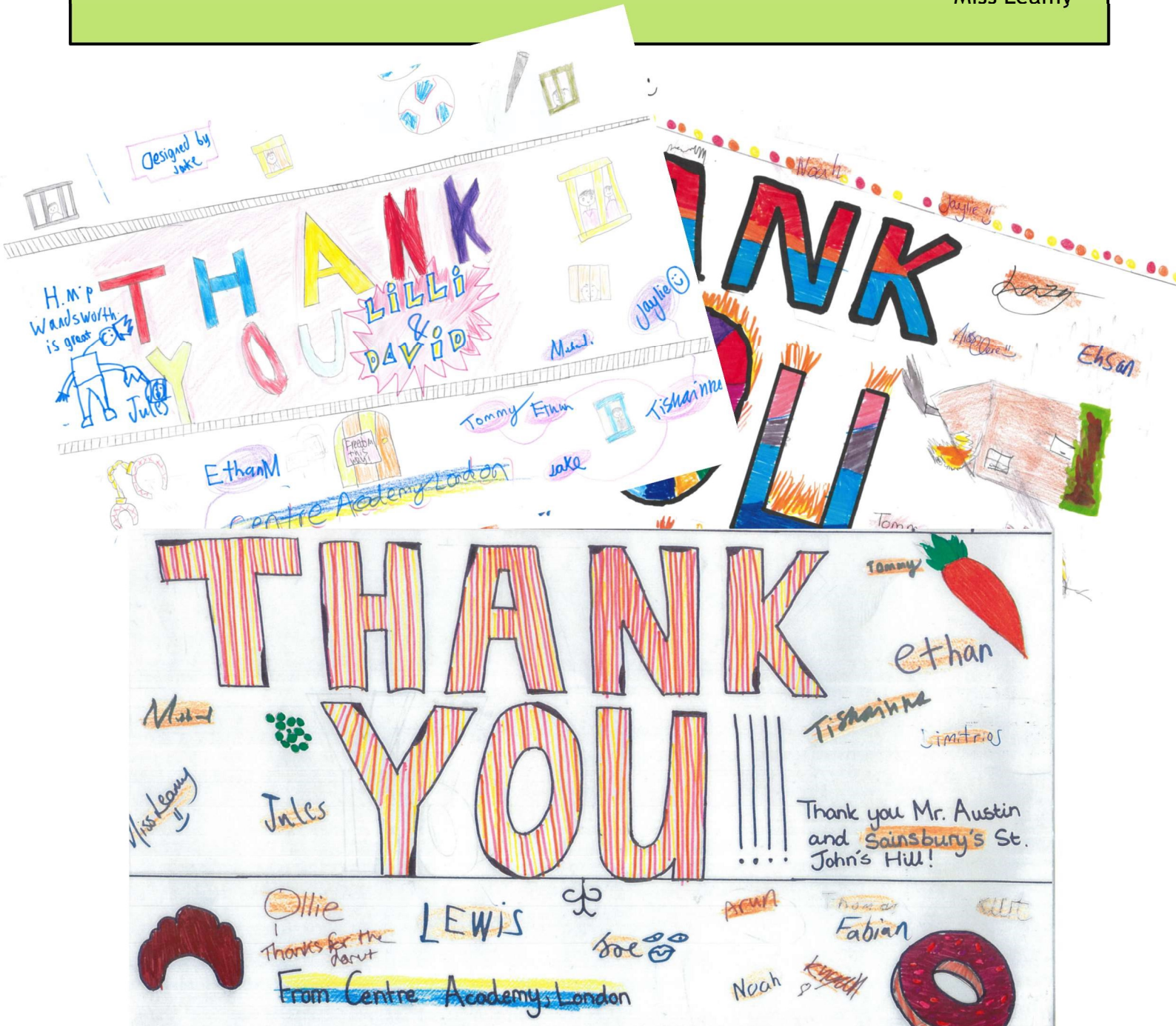
Congratulations to them for winning and well done to all students for their hard work over the week.
