



Staff feature: This week from our Speech & Language therapist:

Unfortunately, because of COVID-19 restrictions, some of you have not been able to meet all the staff that work at our school and with your children, so we thought we could have a staff feature until we can all meet in person. Here is our first introduction from Lisa Akinjayjeu:



I have worked in a number of settings, including specialist provisions and mainstream primary and secondary over the past 20 years in the profession.

My work at school includes teaching all classes for one lesson per week with a focus on social skills and vocabulary development.

In addition, I work with pupils on an individual basis to

carry out assessments and direct therapy according to their needs and EHCP documentation.

I also run the Cooking club on Tuesdays with Miss Rivera which is proving very popular with our students!

It is lovely to see the pupils return to being able to mix across the school and it is hugely beneficial for their social communication and interaction.

Social communication suggestion: The pupils really enjoy board games and especially those with a competitive element. These games provide great opportunities for turn taking and verbal interaction. Games involving a speech and language focus such as '5 second rule' or 'Articulate' are great fun and provide practice in verbal description and speed of thinking.

Vocabulary suggestion: Some of our pupils would benefit from increased exposure to a wider range of vocabulary to improve their comprehension skills. If your child finds reading challenging I would suggest the use of audio books as this provides the exposure to the vocabulary without the barrier of the printed word. In school I also work with individual students to pre-teach vocabulary for key subjects to aid their understanding in lessons.
