
Covid-19 injections





Staff Spotlight – Mrs Leonie Fisher, English.

I was born in Cape Town South Africa and grew up during the apartheid era. This meant that I experienced racial discrimination and oppression as part of my everyday life growing up in South Africa. As part of the systemic racism strategy, the former South African government used education as one of the tools against non-white South Africans. This is what enabled me to recognise the power of education, and it became profoundly important for me to acquire an education and achieve academic success.

Upon completing my secondary school education, I was fortunate to secure a placement at the University of the Western Cape, the only university for non-white South Africans at the time. I pursued a teaching qualification not by choice, but because it was one of the very few career pathways open to me as a non-white South African. I obtained a BA degree at the University of the Western Cape.

My teaching career spans over three decades, having taught in South Africa, South Korea and currently in England. Whilst teaching in England, I developed a keen interest in special education and subsequently switched from mainstream teaching to special education. I completed a Masters degree in Education, with dyslexia as one of my specialisms. As a dyslexia specialist, I have AMBDA accreditation and I am a professional member of the British Dyslexia Association.

I find teaching in special education profoundly rewarding and deeply enriching. I enjoy helping to make a difference in the lives of the young people I teach, especially in the context of making the curriculum accessible to them. The student voice is also very important to me, thus when the GCSE English reforms were implemented, in 2015, it inspired me to undertake doctoral study. I am currently in my final year of PhD study. My thesis title is Exploring the impact of the GCSE English reforms through the voices of students with dyslexia.

In addition to all of the above, I am married and have two adorable children. My daughter is at university and my son is doing his A Levels.
