


We cannot believe how quickly another week has gone by! We will be sending out key events and term dates for your diaries soon, please look out for them.


House tokens and Kindness award

Staff feature: This week from our Occupational Therapist Michelle Rivera

Hello Everyone,

Please let me introduce myself to our new students, parents/guardians. I am Miss Rivera, Occupational Therapist (OT) at Centre Academy London. I have 18 years' experience working with children and young people in different settings, including clinic-based (both National Health Services and private), community and special education schools.

Children and young people at school need to learn and play. My role as an Occupational Therapist is to enhance engagement and participation in school life. In partnership with school staff, child or young person and parents/carers, strategies for enhancing participation will be explored, for example: changing the way the school task is done, recommending or providing equipment, teaching the child, young person, or staff new techniques or developing the child or young person's skills and abilities.

I have weekly group Occupational Therapy activities at school which may include touch typing, writing, drawing, cutting and pasting, or playing sports and games. Additionally, I focus on supporting children and young people with life skills such as shoe-lacing, changing for PE or swimming, eating lunch and managing belongings.

In addition, I work with children and young people on an individual basis and contribute reports to their Special Education Needs assessment or learning support plan.

I've been at Centre Academy for 8 years now and I take great pleasure in seeing these students grow and develop into more confident young men and women.
