COVID-19 guidance

During the summer holidays I went through the new government guidance. I have updated the COVID risk assessment and raised a COVID-19: Major outbreak Management Plan. The good news is that we are moving through the next phase towards "normal" school life; however, sadly, our small school community has suffered during the holidays and members of staff have lost family members and friends, including myself. In addition, some of our staff and students have contracted COVID-19 and are recuperating. I know you share our concerns about keeping everyone safe and you have concerns about the students' learning.

To do this, we need your help.

To ensure that we stay open, we ask that you test your child(ren) on a regular basis. Guidance stipulates twice a week. I would also like to test the students' mid-week now they have returned. This will be until the end of September and we can then review the situation once we have examined the infection rates. Obviously, this will be with your permission and the tests will be conducted confidentially and under strict hygiene conditions. Please continue to inform us when your child has had a test via email. We are currently creating an online form for you to report testing and I will post details of this over the next few days.

I understand that in the past parents and students have chosen not to test. I respect your decision but equally encourage you to look at the figures published both locally and nationally. Our school only has to have **5 students or staff** who have been **in close contact** and are infected to start additional measures being put in place. Our school is small. It would be very easy for us to have a major outbreak and possible closure (please no!) and revert to remote learning.

Enhancing the environment

On a more positive note, the students' return to school has brought the school alive! We have done some maintenance work during the holidays and this will continue for several months to enhance the environment and improve our provision for our students. Uniform

If you are missing some items from your child's uniform, do check with Janice in our office if we have anything in the cupboard before you go shopping. These items are brand new and are often donations from previous parents whose children are leaving the school. I know we have ties suitable for small frame children or middle school and some trousers. We also have some jumpers and a few shirts. Not many older sizes I'm afraid.

The children have asked me about PE kit and the issues they face changing in a small school. Over the next few weeks I will consult with the Principal, staff and yourselves about alternative arrangements that respect their dignity.

Improving communication

Ms Yar, our IT specialist and myself are trying to improve communication and reduce the amount of paper we use. We aim to use as many online forms as possible (so they don't go missing in book bags and rucksacks) and improve efficiency. Finally, homework has been assigned this week and again, we hope to do this digitally by the end of term.
