Dear Parents/Carers, Students & Staff.


The past two weeks have felt like the end of a summer term! The students are settled, new staff feel like old friends and we are all impressed with the maturity of the students who have returned.

I firmly believe that education is not only about academic outcomes but also about helping to raise happy, confident and kind individuals who are equipped for the challenging world ahead, regardless of need or background.

Student Council
