As I have learned a great deal from my students in making me better teacher, I take this opportunity to say a big thank you to all my students.


Half-term house winners

The winners this half-term are **WANDLE**. A fantastic effort and well deserved. Come on Effra and Falcon, reach for the stars! Or rather pizza in this case.


We had a super pizza lunch together today and they thoroughly enjoyed their treat.
