#### New staff

This week, it is the turn of our new Maths trainee teacher, Mr Victor Kinimah to introduce himself to you all:

I was born in Takoradi, which is the third largest city in Ghana. I attended Takoradi Business college and successfully graduated, but because my parent were ordinary farmers and could not support me to further my studies, I could not continue after college graduation because in Ghana, from primary school to university level must be paid for.

I taught as an unqualified teacher from 1984 to 1987, after which I left Ghana to further my studies in the UK, but I went to Italy first and worked a couple of years there to support my younger siblings, so they could join me in Italy. I finally left Italy in 2006 for the UK after they had settled in Italy.

Once in England, I immediately enrolled at East London College to undertake an ACCA course and after obtaining the intermediate qualification, I went to Greenwich University in 2013. I graduated in 2015 with an award of £10,000, which I used to pay for tuition fees for my master's degree in 2015 and I graduated from this in 2017.

After working as an assistant accountant for a year to two, I decided to undertake a PGCE to teach students. I am very passionate about teaching and it keeps me very active, being on my feet most of the time (unlike sitting all the time in front of computers!) I look forward to teaching the students here at CAL.

Victor, you are a wonderful example of how sheer hard work and determination enables you to achieve your dreams. It is quite sobering to hear that if you want to be educated in some countries, you have to pay for it.

#### E-Safety Parent Safeguarding Courses

Please find attached a letter off our Designated Safeguarding Lead, Mrs Samina Yar. She has outlined a number of courses that may be of interest to parents regarding esafety. Teaching students about keeping safe online is of paramount importance and I know that some parents would appreciate some guidance or information on how to keep their children safe at home.

Please have a look and see if there are any that you feel you would like to do. Log yourself on and take advantage of up-to-date national guidance!

#### Uniform

CAL likes our students to have a uniform. For lots of reasons, but primarily for students to be part of our school community and to take pride in being part of it.

As you know, we are very flexible with uniform as we know that some students have sensory needs and we are very mindful of this but we do insist that the students look smart and are comfortable. This is why we allow them to wear PE kit on the days they have PE so they don't have to change at school.

Recently, there has been some discussion with the students about two issues: wearing ties and for the girls, about the length of their skirts.

When it is hot, the students are allowed to take off their ties. When they are in lessons and if the teacher agrees, they may loosen their ties but when they leave the classroom and move around the school, they smarten their ties up again. Teaching them to take pride in their appearance is a life skil and good for their mental health.

The length of girls' skirts is taking up an inordinate amount of my teachers' time to regulate. The uniform policy says knee length and I think it is a sensible rule considering that we have stairs and from the bottom floor, you can see right up to the top and anyone climbing the stairs. Can you see my concern here? In addiiton, in Art & Science, the students sit on stools and legs are more visible. I cannot see how pulling your short skirt down constantly and cupping the back of your legs going up the stairs because your skirt is too short, is comfortable. Therefore, for now, we would appreciate parental support in ensuring that if the girls wear skirts, that they are knee length.

However, we do pride ourselves on listening to our school community so I have asked the School Council to consult with the girls in the school about this. I will also consult with parents but most of the parents I have spoken to already, seem to err on the side of school uniform being smart and comfortable. I'll keep you posted on this.
