Zones of Regulation

During the spring term, the staff received some training about **Zones of Regulation.** Designed by Leah Kuypers, a licensed occupational therapist, it is intended to support students with self-regulation. Self-regulation can go by many names, such as self-control, self-management, and impulse control. It is defined as the best state of alertness of both the body and emotions for the specific situation.

Both the SENDCo and I have noticed that many new EHCPs are coming through referring to this as a tool for all schools to utilise. When I worked in the primary sector, it was widely used and valued, and at first, we did wonder if our older students would respond to it.

Feedback from staff indicates that it is indeed successful when used regularly. The simple language and non-judgemental approach does help the student manage their own behaviour more effectively.


